# **Community rooms available:**

- The Swanson Railway Station was originally Avondale's station. It is actually one of Auckland's oldest railway stations first built in 1879. The community fundraised for it to be relocated in 1996 and worked hard to renovate and restore it. It houses the Swanson café and a community room and is owned and managed by the Swanson Railway Station Trust. Money raised through the Trust helps to maintain the building and to support many local organisations and events.
